

# City teams qualify in baseball

The district baseball tournament at the Southfield Civic Center is guaranteed to be a Farmington-dominated show after all three city teams won pre-district games Thursday.

In the district Saturday, North Farmington will play Farmington in the first game followed by a Harrison-Bedford Catholic Central matchup. The winner goes to the regional at Tempcoce Bedford the following weekend.

North, the Western Lakes Activities Association champ, blanked Livonia Franklin 6-0 behind the two-hit pitching of Mark Temple in the pre-district at Ford Field in Livonia.

Temple struck out 12 and walked three while raising his season record to 8-1.

"He has an excellent fastball, and he blew it right by them," North coach Jim Horwitz said. "It was one of the best games he has thrown this year."

Jesse Gerwatski went the distance for the Patriots (9-12), allowing seven hits and two walks.

The Raiders (13-9) scored their first run on three errors and no hits in the third inning. Franklin committed six miscues altogether.

Temple also had two hits and scored three runs; Jon Sturtz and Adam Chalmers had a double and one RBI each.

In the SYA Invitational Baseball Tournament played Friday through Sunday in the Southfield area, the Eagles won five straight games — four by mercy rule — to capture top honors. The round-robin tournament included teams ages 13-14 from West Bloomfield, Beverly Hills, Ann Arbor, Northville and Troy.

Southfield opened the tournament Friday with a convincing 11-0 victory over West Bloomfield.

Early Saturday morning, the Eagles had their toughest game against Beverly Hills. They shot out to an early lead, then found themselves in a tight ballgame as the Beverly squad rallied back. Southfield eventually earned a hard-fought 11-9 victory.

The Eagles completed their successful weekend with wins over Ann Arbor (19-1), Northville (12-1) and Troy (13-2).

The Southfield Eagles are one of three teams that compose the Southfield Youth Association. The Eagle's are members of the Little Caesar's Amateur Baseball Federation's Sandy Koufax League.

The travel league includes 26 teams throughout southeastern Michigan that play an 18-game league schedule plus post-season play.

The Eagles are basically a young team — only two 14-year-olds — competing against primarily older players. Eagles first-year coach Tom Parker has a 16-person roster.

Parker's goal is to get the players ready for the post-season tournament.




