Hills police open house is June 7

If you've ever wondered what it must be like to be a police officer facing a robbery suspect, you'll get your chance at the fifth annual Farmington Hills police open house on Sunday.

The police department will have the popular Firearms Automatic Training System available for a public try at the open house, noon to 4 p.m. Scenarios — including bad guys and innocent bystanders — will be shown on a screen, and you must decide when to shoot and when not to shoot.

But that's only the beginning. Tours of the police station will be available, as well as a peek at fire trucks and ambulances, police scout cars, a Michigan State Police SWAT vehicle and the Alcohol, Firearms and Tobacco bomb truck.

"The open house is to give the community a better chance to know their police department and to get a sense of how it works," said Lt. Richard Murphy. "It's also a chance to meet police officers and ask them questions."


Farmington Hills Fire Department clowns, the Burger King magicians, Ronald McDonald and Little Caesar will be on hand to greet the kids. Visitors also will see a Tae Kwan Do demonstration, a U.S. Secret Service display and drug education displays.

The Oakland County Sheriff's Mounted Division and Marine Division also will be on hand, as well as the Ferndale police robot.

"It's a role model police officer who walks and talks to the kids," Murphy said.

For fun, visitors can participate in the cake walk and the dunk tank. Visitors also can have their blood pressure checked for free.


