four times as much chance of going to prison as a kid from a two-family home. This is not to say that all kids from two-parent homes will do well. Witness Leslie Williams, the confessed serial killer and rapist.

## Sports drought will mean fewer Olympic medals

n this Olympic year, recent racism could burt the historic dominance of America's dashmen. In 1957 my sprint tenumities on the United States team were mostly black, and African-American runners have essentially ruled ever since. But now our annual

Anti-rean runners in the assertions ruled ever since. But now oil; anitual share of the world's fastest sprint times is declining sharply. The pool of young blacks who could prevent this decline plac list thousands of potential sprinters to prison or violent death.

The imprisonment rate for black males—a group plagued with problems unimaginable to middle-class whites—is 3,370 per 190,000 compared to the overall figure of 456. High school track budgets have been cut, and college scholarships and programs are disappearing as a partial result.
