

Nowak Zeroes In On JCs' Top Job

FARMINGTON Pat Nowak of Farmington is approaching the final stretch of his campaign to get elected national president of the Jaycees.

The City of Farmington resident is one of six candidates seeking the presidency of the U.S. Jaycees. It will be decided during the national convention in Portland, Ore., which begins June 13.

Nowak, who heads a Connecticut Mutual insurance agency in Detroit, announced his candidacy last month and has since been raising funds for his campaign which is expected to cost about \$10,000.

The big money raiser was a dinner held a couple weeks ago in the Huron Valley Hunting and Fishing Club in Farmington. About 60 couples attended the \$25 per plate dinner with all proceeds going to the campaign.

The most notable dignitary at the dinner was U.S. Sen. Robert Griffin of Michigan plus past national Jaycee President Wendell Smith, formerly of Plymouth. Past state Jaycee president in attendance included Bob Padgett of Westland and Pat Duggan of Livonia plus current Jaycee state president Pat Sheridan.

Smith is one of Nowak's big

boosters and is campaigning as hard as Nowak did for him three years ago. When Smith was elected he received a great deal of assistance from Carl Pursell, a former Jaycee who is now state senator for the 14th District, which includes all of Farmington.

When Pursell was elected last November, Nowak was on his campaign team. Pursell and Smith are now returning

past favors to Nowak by helping with the Farmington Jaycees presidency.

Nowak's campaign manager is Wall McQuay, past vice-president of the Farmington Jaycees and now a regional Jaycee officer. The financial drive is being directed by Angie Barbork of the Farmington Jaycees.

Nowak served as president of the Farmington Jaycees the year the club won the Bill Otto award as the most outstanding chapter in Michigan.

He has served a term as president of the Michigan Jaycees and is now completing a year as a national vice-president. If elected, Nowak will take a leave of absence from his agency and spend a year in the Jaycees' White House in Tulsa, Okla.

A number of Farmington Jaycees have planned their vacations to attend the Portland convention and will be on hand to give Nowak

whatever assistance he needs in lining up votes on the convention floor.

THE FARMINGTON Jaycees have pledged to raise \$1,500 as the club's donation to the campaign. A Millionaire's

Party will be held on June 12 to help raise these funds. "Things are going well," Nowak commented Thursday. "I believe there is an excellent chance to win, but with six men in the race, you just have to wait until it's over."

Nowak said he is picking up a lot of pledged support for the second ballot when some of the six candidates may drop out from contention.

"About all we need now, besides money, is an airplane with between eight and 80 seats."
