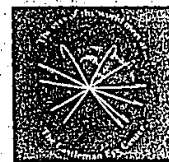

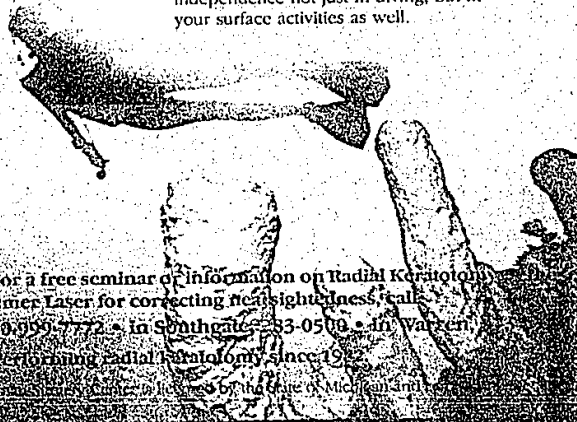
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Faces in the crowd: North Farmington graduates converge on the Cobo Center in Detroit. The three Farmington public schools graduated there on the same day.
