

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

A 32-year-old Redford man was chased and beaten by three unidentified men on Eight Mile near Randall about 9 p.m. Monday, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

Police in Farmington Hills and Livonia responded to an assault complaint. Witnesses told police that the victim, who was driving a

Plymouth, was chased by three men in a Ford pickup across several businesses at Randall and Eight Mile.

One of the three men beat the Redford man, who jumped a barbed wire fence at the rear of a business. One of the three men took the Plymouth and followed by the other two in the Ford drove eastbound on Eight Mile.

The victim apparently went to a nearby business. He was taken to Boinford General Hospital where he was treated for broken ribs and a collapsed and punctured lung. The

victim apparently knew the man who beat him, according to the report:

The owner of a transmission shop on Middlebelt Road told Farmington Hills police someone dumped an engine, which leaked motor oil, behind his store, June 23-24, according to a police report.

The owner of Hi-Tech Transmission, 22330 Middlebelt, said he found a four-cylinder engine and transmission dumped behind his business. Though it can be re-

Two teenagers threw a basketball on fire at a 10-year-old Farmington Hills boy as he rode his bicycle down New Castle Thursday, according to a police report.

The boy had just passed a house where the two teens were outside with a basketball when a basketball on fire was thrown at him. The ball did not hit the boy. When questioned by the police the boys said they threw the ball because they thought it would be funny.
