ities candidates night Monday at Birmingham Groves High School.

But they weren't the only ones. A number of county hopefuls were also there.

"At an event like this, you can meet that one person who can make a difference, who will go door-to-door for you, stuff envelopes, campaign non-stop," said Democratic county executive candidate Betty Howe. Howe faces a primary against Phillip Marcuse for the right to meet GOP nominee L. Brooks Patterson in the fall.

Though not formally part of the event, GOP 9th District congressional hopeful Chuck Forrest was also there, trying to pick up votes in his north Oakland battle with Me-

gan O'Neill, Michael Balian and D. Todd Tindall.

Candidates and members of pro-choice organizations met informally with potential voters, while politicians like state Rep. Maxine Hermon, D-Southfield, urged voters to "change the locker room mentality" in Lansing and Washington.

The 90 or so people in attendance, including a handful of men, were given their marching orders from Carol King of the Michigan Abortion Rights Action League.

"If someone's anti-choice, don't give them your vote," King said.

Since last week's Supreme Court ruling, "phones have been ringing off the hook," King said.

"We're getting calls from Bloom-

field Hills as well as Detroit," she said. "Everyone wants to know what they can do, how they can help."

But not everyone believes pro-choice activism will translate into votes.

County GOP chief James Alexander acknowledged the issue's emotional nature, but said he expected county races to be decided on a variety of issues, including the economy.

Economic and party politics aside, Harriet Rotter of Bingham Farms came to the event wearing a T-shirt depicting a pair of gun-toting women.

"That's my ticket," she said with a laugh. "Thelma and Louise."

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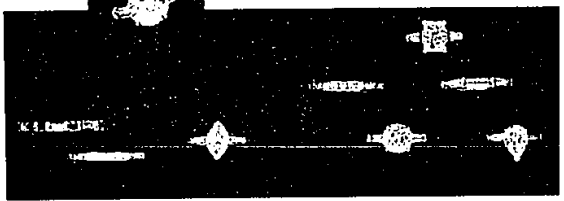
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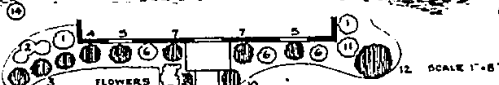
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
