Four others injured in head-on collision

An 50-year-old Novi woman involved in a June traffic accident in downtown Farmington died this week, according to Gary Goss, deputy public safety director for the city, Kate Katz of Novi died July 11 at 1:44 a.m. at Botsford General Haspital, where she had been taken with multiple injuries following the June 7 accident.
