Four Farmington-area high school students are participating in the Michigan State Board of Education Summer Institute for the Arts and Sciences at various colleges throughout the state, according to news releases.

At Olivet College, Harrison High School student Mike Bregand and

Jennifer Chen of North Farmington High School are part of a 110-member student group participating in the program called "Critical Issues and Creative Expressions in the '90s and Beyond." Both have an arts interest in jazz improvisation. Bregand's social science interest is in "Psychological Awareness," and Chen's in "Women's Issues in the '90s."

At Adrian College, Allison MacLennan of North Farmington High School is one of more than 100 students participating in the institute. City places phones in 2 parks

If you ever needed to call someone because you locked your keys in your car or just wanted to call home while at either Heritage Park or Pioneer Park in Farmington Hills, now you can.

The city of Farmington Hills recently installed two Michigan Bell pay phones — one at Heritage Park, near the Visitors Center, and the other at Pioneer Park in the parking lot.

"We didn't have a way before that that someone could make an emergency phone call, say if they locked their keys in the car," said George Morrow, assistant director of special services for Farmington Hills park and golf operations. "I want the people of Farmington Hills to know it's here."

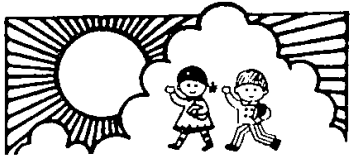
Crowds vary at the two parks on a daily basis. At Heritage Park, for example, park visitors number from 500-1,000 per day, Morrow said.

Joe Guilford, park technician, built a wood canopy structure with a cedar shake roof to house the phone at Heritage Park. The Pioneer Park phone is a drive-up style, Morrow said.
