Below are highlights from the agendas of government meetings this week. All meetings are open to the public.

Farmington Hills City Council

This is the council's regular public hearing meeting.

Under unfinished business, the council will reconsider enacting an ordinance to rezone the northeast corner of Drake and 12 Mile from One-Family Residential to Special Purpose District.

The following public hearings are scheduled for consideration:

- Cost hearing for road rehabilitation for Indianbrook Subdivision and declaration to reimburse project expenditures with bond proceeds.

- Introduction of an amended cluster site plan and open space plan for the north side of 12 Mile east of Halsted to allow a 19-unit cluster housing development in a One-Family Residential.

- Introduction of an amended cluster site plan and open space plan for the west side of Drake north of 13 Mile to allow 18 units.

- Introduction of rezoning request for the east side of Middlebelt north of 12 Mile from RA-1A to RA-1B, both residential districts.

Under new business, the council will consider a consent judgement amendment in the Keston Enterprises case. The council will also consider introducing an ordinance conveying the Miller house, 26570 Drake Road, Historic District Site No. 201, from the city to Mr. and Mrs. Wrobel.

The city manager will offer reports on: bid award recommendations for road rehabilitation for Indianbrook Subdivision, a resolution to approve an installment purchase and short-term financing plan for purchase of park property, and an update on 1992 road construction program currently underway.

The council will hear petitions and communications regarding two proposed block parties for Cass

Court and Birchwood, a request to close Shiawassee and Raphael Street for Family Day Aug. 22, correspondence from the Michigan Municipal League regarding the group's annual meeting, a request from an Alta Loma resident regarding control of satellite dishes and a request for special advertising device for Kensington Manor Apartments.

The city manager will report on the Oakland County personal property contract assessment agreement, the state contract for construction funding of Orchard Lake Road and a proposed equipment building for the 47th District Court property.

He will also ask the council to authorize a repair of a backhoe, propose an expansion of Oakwood Cemetery, request participation in local road special assessment district and handle bids and payments for contractors. Also on the agenda is the retirement of the city clerk.

Among miscellaneous items listed with routine city business are adoption of the city council mission statement and a proposed reorganization of the Farmington Beautification Committee.

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
