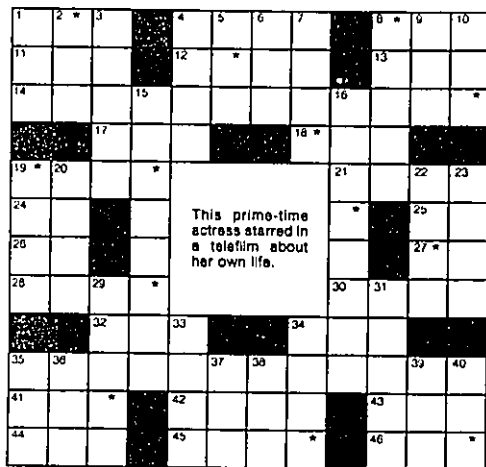


CROSSWORD PUZZLE

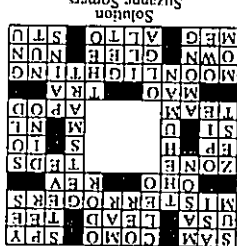

Daytime Emmys; remembering Riley

The elusive Emmy passed Susan Lucci (Erica, *All My Children*) by again, and it was a darn shame. Instead, Erica Slezak (Viki, *One Life to Live*) won the award for Outstanding Lead Actress, although Jessica Tuck (Megan) and Lucci were much better and had a lot more to work with this past year. In a recent interview with Lucci, she said it was great to be nominated 13 years in a row and though she would like to win, it doesn't make much difference to her.

Emmy night wasn't a total loss; there were quite a few surprises and well-deserved awards given. Thom Christopher won for his devilish portrayal of Carlo Hesser on *One Life to Live*. The Outstanding Supporting Actress category had some tough contenders but it was appropriate that Maevie Kinkaid won for her portrayal of Vanessa on *Guiding Light*.

Kristoff St. John won the Emmy for Outstanding Younger Lead Actor, but his performance simply did not compare to that of Patrick Stuart (Will, *All My Children*). Tricia Cast (Nina, *The Young and the Restless*) did deserve to win the Outstanding Younger Lead Actress award. Her scenes with the wicked David were incredible.

I think the biggest surprise was Peter Bergman picking up his second Emmy for his portrayal of Jack Abbott on *Y&R*. I think it is a well-deserved award, but I really didn't think he would win two years in a row.

AMC was named Outstanding Daytime Drama Series and it is about time. It is one of the best-made shows and has many talented people.

A sad note is the death of the actor Larry Riley. Several readers have noted that he did not look well last season on *Knots Landing*. On June 6, the actor died of kidney failure as a complication of an HIV infection.

Riley was best known for his role as Frank on *Knots*, but he also played Calvin Barnes on *The Doctors* for three years, and guest-starred on *Miami Vice*. He appeared in the feature films *Crackers*, *A Soldier's Story* and *Bird*. Riley was also in the TV movies *Muggable Mary* and *Blind Side*.
