Believe it or not this was the second show which Vita produced. Her expertise around community access has been a technical director for many of our other programs. Obviously, the characteristic of following directions and being a quick study lends itself also to being creative and organized as a producer.

Vita Acciafoli has been recognized for a national award at the 15th Home-town USA Video Festival. "Heads You Win" is the name of the program, which Vita produced. Her host was Tom Galante, who is Vita's nephew.

We are very proud of Vita for being recognized at a national level, especially because we all recognize her within our home town as being one of the kindest of our community access people. We all enjoy working with her.

In asking Vita how to encourage other people who are involved as camera, audio, lights to consider being a producer, Vita states: "It takes a lot of courage to try producing your own show the first time. She felt that the opening was particularly "catchy," as they incorporated fast editing of examples showing lots of pictures of the show, choreographed with upbeat music. She felt that it is important for ev-

eryone to remember to keep the interest of the audience, and curiosity about what the show is helps assure viewership.
