## 2 men arrested after robbery, attack

Two men face multiple felony counts, following an incident in which a resident of Independences Green Apartments was attacked and robbed as she returned home from work early Sundays.

Bobby Douglas Tacker, 21, of Dearborn Heights and Josef Lynn Gartner, 18, of South Haven, each face charges in relation to the Incident, which occurred at about 4:14 a.m. in the apartment complex at Grand River and Halated in Farmington Hills.

In the incident, a 22-year-old victim told police a

man got out of his car and attacked her as she arrived home and attempted to get into her apartment build-ing. The man grabbed her, putting his arm around her neck and attempting to drag her toward his car. She kicked and screamed and was able to break free. The man grabbed her purse and fled.

She had acratches on her knees and elbows and had been punched in the head several times, police said. Before attacking her, the man told the victim he had followed her home.

Shortly after the incident, Farmington Hills Officer

Dan Luoma was on patrol in the area of Grand River and Tulane and spotted a car with two occupants matching a description of the suspect vehicle. He stopped the car for a loud muffler and no license plate, and reportedly found the victim's stolen purse in the

car.

Both men were arraigned Sunday in 47th District
Court in Formington before Magistrato James Brady,
pleaded not guilty and are being held on cash bonds in the Oakland County Jail.

According to Farmington Hills Police Det. Sgt. Charles Nebus, Tacker faces felony counts of unarmed

rohbery and attempted kidnapping and misdemeanor charges of possessing LSD and driving with his license suspended. Gartner faces one count of unarmed robbery and a felony count of carrying a concealed weapon, a knife.

bery and a selony count of turny on, a knife.

The unarmed robbery charges are 15-year felonies, the attempted kidnapping is a 10-year felony and the concealed weapons charge a five-year felony.

Tacker is held on a \$100,000 cash bond and Gartner on a \$25,000 cash bond. Their preliminary examination is scheduled for Friday, July 31 in 47th District Court.

gram began, 524 arrests have been made in 399 incidents. Eight-two ceedings have been initiated and 261 vehicles have been

various paraphernalia.

To date, \$152,790 cash, seven vehicles, two cellular phones, 17 beeper pagers and miscellaneous jewelry has been forfeited.
