The shoting victims, both Detroiters, aged 16 and 19, were taken to Bistsford General Hospital and reportedly underwent surgery Saturday morning, One was believed to have been werking security.

A hospital spokesman would not comment on their condition Saturday.

One was shot twice in the side and back, and the other took three bullets in a leg. The youth with the cut hand was treated at St. Mary Hospital in Livonia.
