"I'm more than sure that we had one of the sweetest (taping) schedules in Hollywood. We started at 7:30, and we were finished by quarter after nine. In my opinion, 22 minutes of television doesn't deserve any more than that, if you have a conscientious cast, and a profession cast.

"You go through life wanting challenges, and I certainly do, and that just wasn't challenging enough."

Dutton expects the behind-the-scenes staff to have the most challenging in

scenes staff to have the most challenging job.
"It's going to be on the production staff and the writers because we can't afford to crank out a script and then say, 'Oh, this script doesn't

work, so let's just take a day off to

work, so let's just take a day on to make it—you guys go shopping, and then we'll work on the script.'
"The writing staff will have the hardest task in cranking out, at least, shootable scripts from day

teast, snootable scripts from day one. And from that point on, hopefully, the scripts will get better. "And I think next year, this time, we'll say, 'Aw, man, live is no problem."
