Students find substancefree dorms to their liking

They may have been created simply to pacify lawmakers, but drug-and alcohol-free dorm rooms at state-funded universities in Michi-gan have taken on a life of their

on 1.899, David Honigman, then a state representative, at the request of some concerned Birmingham and West Bloomfield residents, introduced a proposal which would have required state-funded universities to provide special housing for those who don't want alcohol use in their

room. Nervous about the new bill, unlversitles quickly created their own "substance-free" housing to comply with the bill, and figured that was the end of the Issue. But it wasn't.

Now, many universities that initially set saidle a small percentage of rooms for substance-free housing are finding that demand for the rooms is quickly outpacing supply. At the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, for example, housing administrators started with 500 substance-free undergraduate room saignments, which were quickly filled. The following year, the uni-

versity offered 1,400 such slots and received 2,100 applications for them. This fall, U-M has set aside room for 2,000 students in substance-free housing, 20 percent of the university's total undergrad en-

rollment.
Under most universities' programs, students who opt for the special housing are expected to refrain from drug and alcohol use while in the room; they are not, however, required to abstain once they have left the dorm.

Still, some schools do take the ideal of physical well-being fairly seriously. At Oakland Dilversity in Rochester, the substance-free dorn of Anihal House is known as Well-ness House for its attention to overall health.

The dorm, which has been filled to capacity since it was declared substance-free, offers a welght toom, healthy food and devlopmental programs.

"It's a lifestyle choice for the atudents," said Jean Ann Miller, saistant director for student development at OU.

More and more student seven Michlegan University in Kalannazoo, the number of alcohol-free rooms leaped from 50 to 500 in three years. Most university representative offered two explanations for the demand. The optimistic view is that students are becoming more aware of the hazards of substance abuse.
