"That ties into finding ways to hold the line on tuition. We need to continue to make Michigan accessible to people of telent, no matter that their means are," eaid the father of a UM sophomore.

Deitch noted that Republican regent Neal Nicleen, a Brighton attorney, was quoted as saying he

couldn't think of anything nice about the Job. "I feel passionately about the University of Michigan and the need to maintain its excellence," Deitch said.

Besides being party treasurer, Deitch also has been a trustee of the Michigan Canner Foundation, a director of Birmingham's Community House and president of Temple Beth El, general counsel of a bank and a director of several corporations.
