**'News for Kids' a head
start in issue-sorting**

They know how to trick the baby sitter into letting them stay up until midnight, and they even know about the birds and bees long before mom and dad get around to spilling the facts. But further from home, the world is much more difficult to conquer.

News for Kids, TBS' latest endeavor to help children understand the big picture, begins in syndication on Saturday, Sept. 26, then debuts on the cable superchannel the following day.

Pre-adolescents, who may have a faint grasp of worldwide headlines and indeed may not care, can enjoy cartoons for a few more years. But the *News for Kids* intended audience of 9- to 13-year-olds, the "tween" crowd, should take note. Though *News for Kids* borrows footage from sister channel CNN, executive producer Jerry Krieg says the show is tailored entirely for kids, and in some cases, by kids. Young students from around the country have been commissioned into action as bureau chiefs and correspondents.

Perhaps the program's biggest coup is the addition of Action for Children's Television (ACT) founder Peggy Charren to its advisory board. Her crusade against the rampant commercialization of children's television is firmly established, and *News for Kids* seems a perfect showcase for presenting a positive alternative.
