Revision of a \$1-million bond sue to allow school

Revision of a 1-million bond issue to a fallow school remodeling will be an issue facing Glarenceville ovders in the June 14 election.

Changing needs of the district brought on by decreasing enrollments prompted the board of education to seek the revision of the original 8-million bond issue passed in 1985.

The original bond issue earmarked the money

An Oakland County task force has come up with recommendations to put before the local boards of education that would make a 3.14 per cent increase the bargaining maximum in salary increases.

Task Force 29 was made up of one delegate from each board of education in Oakland County. Area representatives included Dr. Samuel Prisk, Clarenceville School District trustee; Aldo Vagnozzi, trustee from Farmington; and Dr. John W. English, Southfield superintendent who advised the group.
