Walsh puts Irish upperclassmen to test

Stanford head coach Bill Walsh continues his 1992 back-to-school tour on NBC Saturday, Oct. 3, when the Cardinal visit Lou Holtz and the Fighting Irish of Notre Dame in a matchup between two highly-ranked national powerhouses. Tom Hammond handles play-by-play duties, joining analyst Cris Collinsworth and sideline reporter John Dackery.

Walsh is in the first year of his much-heralded return to Stanford, where he was defensive-back coach from 1963-65 and head coach from 1978-79. In his previous reign, Walsh compiled a 17-7 record, guiding the Cardinal to two straight postseason bowl victories. He gave up his three-year job as NHC's No. 1 pro football analyst to return to Stanford and the NCAA.

Walsh is best remembered, however, as head coach of the San Francisco 49er team of the 1980s. Under Walsh, the 49ers were able to go from the doormat of the NFC West to three-time Super Bowl winners, with seven NFC playoff appearances and six NFC Western Division titles. Walsh amassed a 10-year record of 102-63-1 and was named Coach of the Decade for his efforts.

A proven winner and masterful teacher, Walsh is expected to catapult Stanford from a regional to national power and place the team in direct recruiting competition with top drawing cards such as Miami and Notre Dame.
