Services were October 1 at Kolbus Funeral Home, Chicago. Arrangements were made by the McCabe Funeral Home, Farmington Hills.

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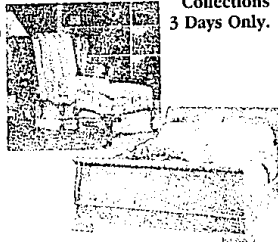
