Sooochiak Pudlat, who was born in 1903 and only began drawing in 1980. In addition to a sole exhibition of original works in Tromoto in 1982, his work has been included in several annual Cape Dorset graphic collections, both stone-cuts and lithographs. He died earleir this spring.

Tikitu Qinnuyuak, who was born in 1908 and was represented in the 1990 Cape Dorset annual graphics collection for the first time in years. He contributed six images to the 1991 collection. His 1992 print "My Mother's Reflections" will be the last print by Tikitu to be released as part of the annual Cape Dorset collection. His late wife was graphic artist Lucy Qinnuayuak. Tikitu died this past January.
