Goodwill Antiques Show. While members gathered for tea, in the authentic saltbox colonial home of Sue Prowse in Birmingham, Annie sat quietly in another room, doing her homework.

Mom was scheduled to drop her daughter off, in the midst of the tea, for a piano lesson at Holy Name. Asked how she manages so much, Rowley said, "You just organize your time. I have a real supportive husband and a very flexible 9 year old." (She has two more daughters, Claudette, 23 and Juliette, 21.)

Rowley is the fur chairman, gathering donations from several area furriers and members too, for this year's show. A registered nurse, who works as a clinical coordinator at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Pontiac, she said, "When I initially joined, I was very interested in helping the handicapped. It's such a nice way to help people help themselves. I'm committed."

Rowley will be one of the three co-chairwomen of next year's antiques show. Among this year's three co-chairwomen are Laurie Walters of Birmingham, mother

of a 9-year-old daughter, Julie, as well as a son Stephen, 6. She works as an accountant part-time at the Birmingham Athletic Club.

"Tina, myself and Carol (Carol Anderson of Rochester Hills), we have jobs and kids but we are trying to make a contribution," Walters said. We work it all in. Our kids are accompanying us to all these things. That's how we work it in."

Walters' mother, Joyce Campbell of Bloomfield Hills, also is member of the Junior Group. The organization has several mothers and daughters as members, as well as several mothers and daughters-in-law.

"I think because the group is flexible on how little or much you do, there's a nice group of young people," Walters said, referring to Junior Group's ability to draw the working moms. "It's like family. All ages blend in."

She said all their nine-year-olds are working in the show. "They wear little aprons and help sell baked goods. Some of our disabled Goodwill clients work the show, and the kids see they are part of it."

The nine-year-olds at the show also include Casey Anderson, whose mother Carol said of the Junior group, "It's been a really nice experience for me. Laurie's one of my best friends. We've really tried to support her this year."

Anderson was an active member until her job — with GM Truck Platform as a purchasing agent — moved from Detroit to Pontiac and made it impossible for her to attend organizational meetings. Now she is an associate member.

At this year's show, she is working on ads for newspaper and

magazines. "I probably spent more time this year on the show because I'm chairing a committee," she said.

"I think you find there's a common goal among women in Junior Goodwill. You've been blessed with healthy children and a nice life. It was time to do something for someone else. A lot of people would not have an opportunity to be employed if it weren't for Goodwill."

The Goodwill Antiques Show features 60 exhibitors from the East and Midwest. In addition to antiques, the traditional Goodwill Booth (donated and refinished furniture and collectibles), pantry, bakery and boutique will be staffed by Junior Group members.
