Korean War hero to be honored by state

■ Farmington Hills has a Medal of Honor winner — Rob-ert Simanek — and the Korean War vet will be honored by the state on Saturday.

There just aren't many like Farmington Hills' Robert E. Simanek in the state of Michigan — and gan is recognizing that fact.

Simanek, a Korean War vetran, holds the Medal of Honor, the highest U.S. military decoration. It's awarded by Congress for gallantry at risk of life above and beyond the call of duty.

"A lot of people don't realize it, but the Korean War was an intense war. — much more intense than the Victnem War," said Simanek, who was wounded in his award-winning action in Korea 40 years ago.

The former Marine noted that some 54,000 were killed in what was then called a "police action."

There are only five Medal of Honor winners left in Michigan, and since 1981, Simanek, 82, will be honored Saturday, Nov. 7, during the Michigan Salute to Veterans at the Michigan Hillsray Affairs and Michigan's adjutant general, will present the state's highest military honor, the Distinguished Service Medal, to Simanek and two others, World War II vets, during a formal ceremony open to the public at 11 a.m.
