people a taste of different kinds of sounds," said Livonia Symphony."

"What makes a live orchestra so special over listening to a CDI being able to watch the different instruments. "A lot of what people felt that weekend besides sadness vas anger and shock. Each section ascends to moments of anger, and ontains all or part of the initial melody."
Tew wrote the composition for

Tew wrote the composition for strings he said, "because they can sing without breaking the melody." It is a melodic work. Everything that people don't like about modern music isn't in there, It's a natural free flowing melody using basic harmonies."

Tew has played viola for more than 25 years in community orchestras. He studied music there are the proposition under Dr.
