

S'fld woman achieves award for program to aid disabled

Sally Manns of Southfield is winner of the top ABLE award from Ability is Ageless. Manns, 56, is director of client services at Kenny Rehab.

Her program was recognized for helping people with severe physical disabilities. The award came last week at a luncheon sponsored by the American Association of Retired Persons and businesses.

Manns had polio herself at age 17. She has been with Kenny Rehab 32 years.

The awards are given each year to individuals who exemplify the value of experience through the way they carry out their work. Eight other winners of "most ABLE" awards are:

■ Sister M. Martina Mastey, CSSF, director of a learning center which serves as both an alternative educational option for local children and a learning site for

Madonna University student teachers. The 78-year-old Livonia resident is a trained educator and psychologist who established the center in 1952.

■ Edith Bogle of Oak Park, a nurse and home care coordinator at Harper Hospital. A cancer survivor, Bogle coordinates the transition from hospital to home for cancer patients.

■ Fred Brown, 68, of Detroit, a substance abuse therapist at Vantage Point, an out-patient clinic. The former professional baseball player works primarily with adolescents.

■ Mary Ann Bush, a senior community health nurse with the Visiting Nurse Association of southeast Michigan. Bush, 61, of Detroit, helped establish a program of nursing care for home bound patients with AIDS.

■ Stephen Paul Davis, 76, execu-

tive director of the Parkside Inter-generational Center of Project SAVE in Southwest Detroit. Davis gave up his profession as a portrait painter because of an automobile accident that limits his ability to stand for long periods.

■ Clayton Landon, 78, of Shelby Township, a retired assembly worker. Three years ago, Landon went to work for Lionel Trains, assembling tiny train parts and consistently exceeding his production goals.

■ Horace L. Sheffield Jr., 76, executive director of the Detroit Association of Black Organizations (DABO). The civil rights activist and labor leader also writes for The Michigan Chronicle.

■ Elisabeth Tullis, director of nursing at Boulevard Temple Retirement Home in Detroit. Tullis, 71, has implemented a nursing-free program. She supervises a staff of more than 100.

MADD seeks court OK of sobriety checks

Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) is hoping the state Supreme Court will approve the constitutionality of sobriety checkpoints on Michigan roads.

The state's highest court announced last week it will review the Michigan Court of Appeals decision.

"We're very pleased that the Michigan Supreme Court has agreed to hear the arguments on

sobriety checkpoints," said Bethany Goodman, executive director of MADD Michigan.

The attorney general's office will file briefs by Dec. 24.
