Water line break gives NFHS students day off

North Farmington High School canceled classes when a four-inch east iron pipe that connects the school to a water main on 13 Mile Road broke early Wednesday morning.
Classes were canceled when school officials were told repairs would take four to eight hours, said North Farmington principal Deborah Clarke.
Clarke also said the break

did not occur on school property but at the construction site across the street.
"It happened at the worst spot because it was underneath the road," said Jim Porter, manager of water and sewage operations for Oakland County.
Repairs were completed by 2:30 p.m. that day and classes resumed on Nov. 4.

Bush did with students what he couldn't at polls

Although he didn't win re-election with voters around the country, President George Bush was the overriding favorite of elementary school students in the Farmington area.
At nine of 13 elementary schools in the Farmington district, 1,304 voted for Bush, 828 voted for President-elect Bill Clinton and 622 cast ballots for independent candidate H. Ross Perot. Eight cast ballots for other presidential candidates.
Beechview, Eagle, Flanders, Hill, Highview, Hillside Kenbrook Longacre and Wood Creek elementary schools all reported student election results favoring Bush.
At Flanders, Gill and Highview, Perot came in second place.
Students at Our Lady of Sorrows Elementary also cast ballots on Nov. 3, with Bush garnering 271 votes, Clinton 58 and Perot 55.
Over at Alameda Early Childhood Center, a special kind of election was held, offering students a choice of "Miss A," "Mr. T" or "Mr. F" for president. By popular choice, students selected Miss A — the first female president.

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
