The second major fashion story is Lagerfeld, Lagerfeld, Lagerfeld and Lagerfeld. Four times did King Korl pick up his seissors to create out-standing Pet-a-Porter collections for Fendi, Chloe, Korl Lagerfeld and Chanel. Such versatility, such creativity, such stamins, such expres-

sions of genius have never before been achieved by one designer. For each label, Lagerfeld achieved what few designers can accomplish in a single collection—a coherent series of styles that proclaim a unique message to the observer and especially to this Eccentric/Observer.

First came Lagerfeld's designs for Sendi in Milan where his dresses over pants were focused on the new sil-houette.

Second was Lagerfeld's first collection for Chloe after a seven-year lapse. It was at Chloe in the 1970s that Lagerfeld invented 'le flou'—the fluid colores that marked the beginning of Pret.a-Porter collections and for practical purposes the demise of the ultra-high-priced couture.

It was in the same spirit of the Chloe he created 20 years ago that Lagerfeld generated this new collection where the boundaries between day and night are blurred, as well as the boundaries between garments in a profusion of soft layering. Long, lean, soft and supple; in many cases using sheer fabrics in pale vanilla or pastels; sometimes with small, spaced geometric prints resulting in a very feminine and ansual look. Lagerfeld used six-foot-long scalloped, soft suede belts in dark accent colors, worn looped to the side, with the ends hanging to the knees, to add to the softness and to the impression of length.


