Drumming up support

Pro-life activist denounces ACLU tactics

Pro-life activist Lynn Mills of Livonla says the American Civil Liberties Union is trying to gen-erate public sympathy for a law-suit that names her as a co-de-fendant because "they don't have a case."

The Livonia resident recently criticized a published report on the nearly year-old lawsuit that stems from a 1991 protest outside the Women's Advisory Center on Six Mile in Livonia.

The lawsuit, filed in Wayne Circuit Court last December, claims Mills and Sr. Lois Mitoraj of the Felician Sisters violated the privacy of two teenage clinic clients by including their names on placards used in the June 8, 1991

A story on the lawsuit — spot-lighting the ACLU's previous de-fense of Mills' right to picket abortion clinics — appeared in a recent Detroit News.

"The ACLU went seeking me-dia attention. Because they don't have a case they're going to go try and play it out in public," Mills said.

Paul Denenfeld, ACLU legal director, disputed Mills' characterization and said the lawsuit "has great deal of merit."
The lawsuit has been assigned to Wayne Circuit Judge John Kerwin. Depositions were taken lest month but no trial date has been set.


The lawsuit asks for at least \$10,000 in damages and charges the defendants with public disclosure of private facts, intrusion



upon seclusion, and intentional infliction of emotional distress. The plaintiffs were named on

the two signs, which urged: "Don't Kill Your Baby." Mills said the names were obtained by a third party, who found clinic records in the trash. She said the clinic, not protestors, was "responsible for violating their confidentiality." Mills said it was the first time names were used in a Michigan abortion protest, although the tactte had been used previously in other states.

She said she plans to continue using the strategy, depending on circumstances, regardless of the leavestic outcome.
"We may do something like use a first name and last initial though," she conceded.
Dennefield said while the ACLU doesn't believing in abridging anyone's right to protest, the defendants' actions went too far.
