The Rockets, who never led until the final seconds, captured their first state title on a razzledazzle, flea-flicker pass play involving a quarterback who was nearly sacked and a receiver who happened to be in the right place at the right time.

With Walled Lake elinging to an 18-14 lead, Reeths-Puffer had the ball at the Warrior 37-yard line with 30 seconds remaining. Rocket quarterback Geoff Zietlow, after handing off to DeMarko Hill and eventually getting the ball back from Luke Bates on a fake reverse, spotted tight end Scott Goudie downfield and threw a pass in his general direction.

It appeared as if Zietlow's pass was well covered.

Western defensive back Dave Watkins slapped at the ball and nearly had it intercepted around the 10-yard line. But the ball fel securely into the arms of surprised flanker Stacy Star who rambled in for the game-winning, 37-yard touchdown.

Rocket fans went wild, but the Warriors had 19 seconds left to mount a miracle of their own. Western's prayers were never answered.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE C-42-92, an ordinance to amend Chapter 14, Recycling, Composting and Solid Waste Disposal, of the City Code of the City of screened from view on all aides.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS:

Section 1. 4.1, Definitions, of Chapter 14, Recycling, Composting and Solid Waste Disposal, of the City Code of the City of Farmington Hills is hereby amended to add the definition of dumpater, which definition shall read as follows:

Section 1.4-5, Establishments, of Chapter 14, Recycling, Composting and Solid Waste Disposal, of the City Code of the City of Farmington Hills is hereby amended to add Subsection (f), which subsection shall read as follows:

(f) Dumpsters shall be screened from view on all sides. Such screening shall consist of any permanent building wall, obscuring wall, fencing (solid) or earth mound which is not less than six (6) feet in height or at least one (1) fool above the height of the enclosed dumpster, whichever is greater. Gates providing access shall also provide screening.

Section 3.

The requirements for the enclosure of dumpsters shall apply to all dumpsters located within the City on or after September 1, 1993.
