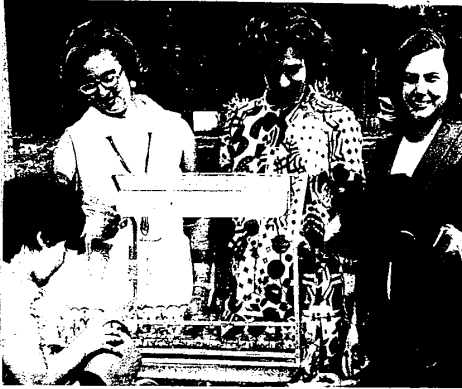
All secondary sessions will be held in Harrison High School, 29995 12 Mile Rd., while elementary classes are set at both Cloverdale Elementary School, 32000 Freedom, and at Kenbrook Elementary, 32180 Bonnet Hill.

An exclusive three-week session on basketball begins June 28 and runs through July 18. All classes will meet Monday through Friday with the exception of July 5, according to Donald Howell, director of extended school services. Fourth through sixth graders will meet from 9-11 a.m.; seventh through ninth graders from 11 a.m. - 1 p.m.; and 10th through 12th graders from 4-6 p.m.

All basketball sessions will meet in the Farmington High School gym.

The schools are offering still another special feature—band lessons for all fourth, fifth and sixth grade band students at all levels of advancement. Daily classes will meet Monday through Friday, beginning Tuesday, June 29 and ending Tuesday, Aug. 10. Sessions will be offered at two sites only—Cloverdale Elementary from 8:30 - 10 a.m. and at Kenbrook Elementary from 10:30 a.m. - noon.
