CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary) A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Hartsock at 8:00 p.m. on December 21, 1992, in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan. Notice of the meeting was posted in compliance with Public Act 267-1975. PRESENT: Campbell, Hartsock, McShane, Richardson, Tupper. ABSENT: None. OTHERS PRESENT: City Clerk/Treasurer Cantrell, City Manager Deadman, City Attorney Donohue, Assistant Director Gushman, Director Laiboff, Adm. Assistant Schultz. Minutes of the previous regular meeting of December 7, 1992 were approved as written. Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed. Council approved the appointment of Joan D. Dudley as new magistrate for the 47th District Court, effective January 1, 1993. Council approved funding for one boy from Farmington High School to attend Michigan State University for the 1993 Boys State Program, and appointed Councilman Tupper as a contact person. Council received and filed engineering report on the Bel Aire Sanitary Sewer Monitoring, and will inform the residents by letter the results of the metering study. Council authorized contractor payments of \$154,914.05 for Payment No. 25 and approved Change Order No. 9 and 10 to Posco Construction, \$16,720.00 to Black and Veatch for work completed through November 20, 1992; and Change Order No. 9 to Dan's Excavating, Inc. for work completed on the Sewer Improvement Project. Council authorized a construction management contract with John Allen Architect for \$12,934.00 plus fifteen per cent architectural fees for the installation of new locker rooms for public safety officers. Council authorized the Mayor to execute the Administrative Services Agreement (MSA) Deferred Compensation Program. Council comments and announcements were heard including the following: Council instructed staff to prepare a resolution supporting the schools' decision to combine millage proposals into one election. Council appointed William Ingalls to a 3 year term on the Farmington Building Authority and Jeanne Liming to a three year term on the Cable Access Committee. Council scheduled a special meeting for January 19, 1993 from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. for 1993 Council Planning Session. Council adopted Master Bank Depository and Facsimile Signature Resolutions authorizing the name of Frank J. Lauboff be added and the name of Robert F. Deadman be removed effective January 5, 1993.
