

MetroVision acts to comply with federal law

CABLE CONNECTION

The Cable Television Consumer Protection and Competition Act of 1992 was intended to promote competition in the cable industry and help curb unfair rate increases. This law also grants local government additional authority and has encouraging sections to promote community services through increased cable technology.

Implementation of this law is waiting on direction from the FCC, most of which will be clarified by April of 1993. One example of a change is with the leased and access channels, including public, government, and education.

The FCC must promulgate regulations to enable an operator of a cable system to prohibit the use, on such system of PEG channels of any programming containing obscene material, sexually explicit conduct, or material soliciting or promoting unlawful conduct.

MetroVision therefore has initiated a policy to adhere to this law. They are encouraging persons desiring to use any leased or public

access facilities to comply with this law. This will be done in the form of a signed statement which may be picked up at either the MetroVision or SWCCC office.
