Belanger estimated the proposal would save every Redford Union homeowner 3300 a year.

"The concept of unity is new to school finance reform," Belanger said. "We speak in one voice which can't be ignored. Thero's something in this for everyone."

Proponents started the petition drive one day before the Michigan Logislature begins its new session. Backers have six months to get the 205,000 valid signatures needed to present the petitions to the Michigan Legislature.

Lawmakers then have 40 days to either approve it or reject it. If the proposal is not approved, it will appear on the 1994 ballot. Affixed Tuesday were the first of the 270,000 signatures being sought. Petitions are available at local school district offices. The O'R, Plan, named after former Detroit school board member David Olmstead and University of Michigan professor Phil Kearney, would limit all district operating levies to 30 mills. "It reduces reliance on the property tax," said Redford Union now levies 40.03 mills. This would be rolled back to 30 mills and the state would pick up the rest. It's a 25 percent reduction in property taxes for Redford Union residents."
