projects is that clusters are attached, but the home and property are owned by the buyer.

An attractive feature, Allen

added, was that the developer provided maintenance for project residents.

Mrs. Elizabeth Brennan of Drake Rd. said she was against the rezoning but would like the 22 adjacent acres she owns rezoned to multiple if the property in question were rezoned.

Councilman Fred Siebert said that the city's engineer, John Hiltz, reports the property cannot be developed with individual dwelling units because of the severe fall of the land presents a danger of land movement and possible mud slides.

Siebert added that Drake is in deplorable condition and development could expedite paving of that road.
