Judge upholds ex-banker's suit

Former banker Stanford C. Stoddard of Birmingham may be on his way to collecting some of the \$720,000 he says Michigan National Corp. owes him for defending himself on federal

charges.

Oakland Circuit Judge Steven M. Andrews set March 29 for a trial to determine the amount after ruling aummarily in favor of Stoddard on legal

in favor of Stoddard on legal principle.
Stoddard was chairman of Michigan National, a bank holding corporation, from 1971, until he was forced out in 1984. He successfully fought federal charges of missipplication of Cunds and insisted the corporation should have paid for his federase.

"It is my understand that Michigan National's directors have not personally paid for

any of the huge legal costs which have been incurred to defend themselves against my lawsuits, both in their capacity as individual directors and as to the corporation," Stoddard said in a statement. In that suit, Stoddard is seeking exemplary damages from the directors in addition to his legal costs.

Andrewa' order leaves open the possibility that Stoddard and the bank could agree on a sum before he must try the

Stoddard, who now operates Stodard, who now operate a financial services company in Southfield, said he has spent \$2 million altogether on defense counsel in all the cases. Stoddard won, on appeal, against a Federal Reserve Board order barring him from banking.
