Hills approves connector improvement

Farmington Hills took another step toward completion of the Haggerty connector — the planned super highway that would connect the Oakland County's northern and western communities to 1-96.

On March 16, the city council voted unanimously to spend an estimated \$41,250 to upgrade two traffic signals. That will be the

city's share of extending the mast arm signal on Haggerty to accom-modate the proposed widening of 12 Mile just east of Meadowbrook Road in Novi to 800 feet east of Haggerty Road and improving the signal at the crossover just east of Haggerty.

Novi and Farmington Hills will share the cost of the signal im-

provements near Meadowbrook. Farmington Hills will pay the cost of the signal just east of Hag-gerty.

The first phase of the connector is under construction. It will provide ramps from 1-275/fi-696/1-96 to the existing interchange extended to 12 Mile.

The Michigan Department of

Transportation has set April 14 as the target date for receiving construction blds, with construction to begin two months after that date.

Assistant city manager David Call said he expects the entire project to be finished in 1999 and this part of the project to be complete in 1995.


