Teacher finds that students keep him young



William Grace Elementary kindergarten teacher Ron Freudenburg is something of an anomaly: He's male and he's 64 years old. The youngsters in his class don't seem to mind, though. And neither does their

A sugary snack, 18 squirming kindergartners and two pairs of untied shoes would normally add up to one rounding bandehe

dergartiers and two pairs of united shoes would normally add up to one pounding headeche.

Their youth, though, is their teacher's sapirin.

"I guess there's still a little boy in me that thinks like they do," said Ron Freudenburg, 64, nearly 60 years removed from such childlike The stereotypical kindergarten teacher is usually young and a woman. Five- and 6 year olds at William Grace Elementary don't seem to notice, though.

On this Thursday afternoon, Freudenberg has his hands full.

The clock inches closer to 2:20 p.m. Children huddle around to listen to Freudenburg's soft, compelling narrative of "Danny and the Dineaux."

A tale of a large reptile holds away for a few minutes. The ants infiltrate some pants.

Freudenburg rests the book on his knee, placing his hand on the shoulder of one fidgetting pupil. Without saying a word, the boy rejoins the circle.

sweatshirt.
"I'm not doing strings now," said
Freudenburg, barely above a whisper.
"I'm reading a story."
Soon, the bell rings. The children

Freudenburg dispatches a few stragglers with unrequited kindness. He kneels down to tie a couple of pairs of shoes, fastens a backpack, and zips up a boy's winter coat.

"He really has a way with kids," said Judy Wilson, a pareprofessional who works in Freudenburg's class. "Ho's got patience with these kids. He understands them."

They're normally not this hyper, Freudenburg said. The culprit: Marshmallow bunnies consumed during anack time.

Freudenburg asks kids to bring a healthy treat, usually something like carrois and dip. Someone didn't get the message.

"What do you do?" said Freuden-berg, who relented and gave the glu-cose goodies to his pupils.

After 42 years of teaching elemen-tary school kids, some situations still leave Freudenburg a bit perplexed. Ho's taught every grade in the ele-mentary level except first.
