My children tell me that I am paying higher prices than if I went to the stores. This is so easy for me that I hate to give up the convenience but I am concerned about the cost.

A. Shopping by mail is convenient and easy. Sometimes you can get bargsins but at other times you will be paying extra for the convenience. It may pay you to compare the prices of the fiems you wish to order with the prices in stores and also in other catalogs. When you do this comparison, make certain that you also include the cost of shipping and handling. These additional fees add to the price of the merchandies. Additional safeguards: Will the company you are ordering from refund not only the cost of the item but the shipping charges as well, is satisfaction with the merchandies guaranteed and how long will you have to

with the merchandise guaranteed and how long will you have to wait for your order? Remember, too, never to send cash through the mail. A check or money order, if you are not using a credit card, is the safest way to handle these transactions.

Essential tremor, according to the article, is one of the most common movement disorders and can affect people of all ages. It appears to disappear, unlike Parkinsonian tremor, when the person is relaxed.

Strangely enough, it also may disappear or become greatly reduced when small amounts of acohol are consumed. However, once the effects of the alcohol wear off, the tremor returns and may be more severe than before.

Little is known of the cause of ET and the condition appears to be unstudied and underrecognized. There is, however, an organization, the International Tremor Foundation, that has been established to provide information about tremors to those

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


W.B.: "You mean to tell me there's a play for 12 tricks?"

W.W.: "Most certainly there's always a play, but that doesn't guarantee a successful result. The more I examine the lay out the better the chance seems to be. I'd try for three hearts, four spades, three clubs and two dilamonds or any combination thereof, I'd be delighted to win. The heart suit is crucial, for that matter spades and clubs are too. Maybe there's a dilamond, spade squeeze on East. Let's see. At (1) I'd win dummy's heart jack and play to my king and when East followed, I would be sure that I could correct the count by playing two more hearts, but not yet. First the club nine and if East didn't cover, I'd let it ride. If he did rise, I'd win and play a spade at trick (4) to the jack. If East didn't cover my club nine I'd play my heart ace. At trick (6) and (7) the last two clubs and at (8) I'd throw West in with a heart which would squeeze East in spades or diamonds. Whichever suit East unguards you have your 12th trick in that suit."


