The producing/directing team of Tracy Thompson and Todd Whitman have started a new production called "Adventures With Pirate Pete." The concept developed when Tracy wanted to share some of her adventures in travel and education, and suspected that there were other residents of the community who would have stories to tell. The preproduction for the show took many months, as the twosome created and constructed a pirate ship set for the show, which adds depth and interest to the program. A local actor, Art Cady, is the talented Pirate Pete. The first segment of the show featured an adventure to the "Bear Country" of Churchill, Manitoba, where "Nanook of the North" tarries, awaiting the freezing of Hudson Bay, before journeying northward to the Arctic in search of seals. This show is currently being cablecast on Metro-Visión Channel 12 during the month of May.

The second segment features a trip "Down the River," wherein Todd relates his experience river rafting down the New River. This show will begin its cablecast in June. Consult your local access TV guide for times and days.

In order to make the half-hour show more visually exciting, the directors incorporate at least ten minutes of B-roll during each presentation. This B-roll can be video, still pictures converted to video, or even film transferred to video. Each adventurer is also
