arranged for 27 Ford High School 10th graders to be picked up by bus one day a week after school, come to the AT&T Southfield office, get a snack and then meet with the same tutor regularly for help in English or Math. The tutors are all AT&T management people.

"Everyone loves this program," Collins said, "Our biggest problem is that we can't offer it to all 2.400 students at Henry Ford."

Ford's Assistant Principal, Linda Spight, agrees this is a wonderful program for their students. Oftentimes, she said, it becomes a bonding experience for the students, as well as an educational one.

"They not only get help with their school work, they also have a chance to see what it means to be in a work environment," she said. "They also develop a more positive attitute towards people in business. Many of the students talk to their tutors on the phone and get together with them at different times."

Detroit Compact is a five-yearold program. It is an educational partnership with local businesses, unions, higher education groups, community groups, members of

state and city government, the Detroit Board of Education and the general superintendent, principals, teachers, parent and student organizations in the Detroit public schools.

And, as Sherwood points out, statistics show the program appears to be working.

Thirty of the original 33 graduates who entered college in 1990 returned as juniors. This is a 91 percent retention rate. Of the 37 students who entered college in 1992, 35 (95 percent) returned as sophomores.

"There's a positive movement in student achievement at the middle and high school levels as well. Sherwood said. "At McKenzie High School in Detroit, for example, reading skills increased 42 percent and math skills improved 33 percent among the Detroit Compact stu-

While the program is working for many students, Cyteria said she wishes it could help more.

"I wish all of my friends would get at least a two-point average in school.," she said. "I plan on getting a four-point by the time I'm a high school senior."
