# Donahue right for U-D job



If it comes down to picking the right man for the job — the man with the proper connections, the best credentials, the most experience — then Glen Donahue steason.

No one else interested in coach ing the Titan shas nearly as much experience. None have proven they can recruit any better (not even Perry Watson — more on the later). And, although the other candidates would argue otherwise, they could not possibly be as committed to a school as Donahue is to UID-M.

So why the wait? What are Titan officials debating about? Why bother interviewing anyone else? Why don't they just hire him? Their answer Well, let's be thorough. Let's be fair.

Those are just dodges, of course, which I fear will lead to one of those "other factors to consider" replices as an explanation when someone else is hired.

This much I know. If someone else is chosen to replace Ricky Brydsong — who for a reason I will never comprehend resigned to take the complete of the work be because he's better qualified.

### A solid record

A solid record

There's so much to be said for Donahue's credentials. Teams under his direction have won more than 600 games, with the majority coming in the college ranks. He took a struggling St. Mary's College program and in four years turned it into a contender for the NAIA national title.

Thing is, Donahue wouldn't have been in position to turn St. Mary's around if he had been hired at UD-M instead of Byrdsong. He had coached just one year at St. Mary's when he interviewed for the UD-M job.

But UD-M officials decided against Donahue, an alumnus (class of '58) and former assistant coach ('88-87), in favor of Byrd-

song — who had no local ties but had two factors in his favor. He was young and he was black. Donahue is neither. And, chances are, if he is passed by again, those will be key factors. The perception is only a black coach can recruit in the city, and only a young coach can relate to today's players.

Generalizations 'like that are unfortunate. In Donahue's case, they're untrue. He's proven he can coach and recruit in the city — he was 401-205 in 20 seasons at Highland Park Community College. And he's had no trouble relating to young players. He took over the Redford Bishop Borgess program last fall, just two weeks before the start of fall practice, and did a creditable job.

But there are more important traits his credentials don't reveal. The right attitude

The right attitude

For one, Donahue is a strong rebounder. When St. Mary's program folded underneath him, just a few days after he had taken them to the NAIA National Tournament, he was stunned.

Who wouldn't be? But he over-came it, never allowing bitterness and resentment to anchor him. He began searching for a place to coach, but not until after all his returning players at St. Mary's were taken care of.

If UD-M officials need an example of Donahue's loyalty, they need look no further.

What is bound to be used as an excuse for hiring someone clse is age. Donahue is 58.

But he's no dummy. He knows how to turn what could be perceived as a detriment into a positive.

"One of the thinys I empha-

perceived as a detriment into a positive.
"One of the things I emphasized," he said from his Southfield home of his interview at UD-M two weeks ago, "is that I'd be there for the long haul. This would not be a stepping stone for me. I want to spend the rest of my career there."

me. I want to spend the rest of my career there."

And how long would that be? Donahue has no other interest except coaching. If he kept the job for eight years, he'd be third in longevity in UD-M's basketball history, which dates back to 1905.

What could he bring to the program? An unwavering attitude, for one. He is always positive. And he has an established program.

A proven recruiter

He likes the running game, and he likes to use 10 players in a constant shuffle.

Could he recruit city players? He did before (at Highland Park CC), while facing tougher odds. The popular opinion is that Watson would be better suited for the UD-M job because he coached as successfully in the city (at Detroit Southwestern) before becoming an assistant coach at Michigan.

However, Watson burned a lot of bridges at Southwestern. He would probably have more trouble associating with Detroit PSL coaches than Donahue would. And Donahue has an established association with the Detroit Catholic League, at Borgess and through St. Mary's.

He also knows what it takes to win. "The key to it has always been the players," he summed up. "I've never had a good team with-out good players."

Donahue is confident he will get the job. "There's been more talk that U-of-DM needs a local guy, a guy who has built up good, local ties. I really fit the bill, so I've got to be positive."

One of Byrdsung's problems was laying a foundation in Detroit after arriving from Arizons. He had just one winning record here in five seasons. "I think he narrowed the gap," said Donahue in evaluating Byrdsong's recruiting progress. "If he had stayed, they would have gotten better and better."

But he didn't, and now it will be someone else's task to put the Titans back on the map in bas-ketball.

Can Donahue do it? Probably. Will he get the chance? Well, let's hope so.
