"Rising Day" and "Descending
Night" stand at either end of the
mall, where nearly benches and
greeney create a feeling of respite
for the shopper. The 5-foot-tall
bronze statues were created by
Adolph Alexander Weiman in
1914 and acquired by Somerset
partner Maurice Cohen from the
Hirschl & Adler Galleries in New
York.

The pair of bronzes were cast from the sculptor's working models (now destroyed), which were commissioned to commemorate the opening of the Panama Canal and the joining of the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. They were first seen in plaster at the World's Fair of the time in San Francisco.

Works of art are not exclusive to "new" malls. The Westland Center, built in 1965, has several objets d'art: two fountains, two sculptures and a very old giant

rubber tree.
"Shoppers tell us the sound of
water from our fountains is relexing," said Claudia Frederick,
Westland Mail's marketing director. "The huge rubber tree in
front of Hudson's is a conversation piece. The sculpture in front of Penney's, "Framed Figures," represents a crowd. It was created by Fritz Koenig, and has been here since the mall opened."
