Every year the cities of Farmington and Farmington Hills study the worst tributary areas still needing resusci-tation.

tributary areas still needing resusci-tation. Friends of the Rouge annually look for volunters. This year's site was near the Farmington Nursing Home at Folsom and Tuck — the same as last year. In choosing a site, access by heavy equipment is a consideration. "We filled two 30-yardrer," Harrett, a five-year city employee, said.
