"It's funny because you have children, yet it's "It's funny because you have adults playing children, yet it's very lanightful," said Madias. "It pokes fun at race relations, wacky relatives, and sibling relationships."
"I love playing a 5-year-old. I can do anything I want," said Cherasano, 24, a graduate of Troy Athens High School and the University of Detroit.

Some of her other roles include Mary Brenham in "Our Country's Good" at the Attic and Ida in "First is Supper" at the Jewish Ensemble Theatre.


