Nuts may reduce risk of heart attack

Did you know that...

Several recent medical reports have suggested that eating nuts (mostly peanuts, almonds, or walnuts) may reduce the risk of heart attacks. To create resulting the peanuts of the content of the c explore possible explanations for this finding, re-

Moing outside in cold weather with wet feet, wet hair, or wet clothing won't make you any more susceptible to colds or the flux. The key to catching a cold is being exposed to a virus to which you are not immune. It really doesn't matter whether you are wet or dry.

Small metal mesh tubes, called stents, can now be inserted permanently into the heart's ar-

teries to keep them open. These devices work like tiny scaffolding to prevent the artery from collaps-ing or closing.
