# Traffic from page 1A

Among those who agree is William C. Hartwig, administrator of project planning at the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT). "As that area continues to grow, so do the traffic prob-lems. They're not going to go

away. They realization — that traffic problems "won't go away" — seems to be at least part of the reason three separate entities are hoping Wednesday's meeting is successful.

Besides MDOT, the Southeast Michigan Council of Govern-ments (SEMCOG) and the Road Commission for Oakland County

are involved in the preparation leading up to the meeting, said Hartwig.
"And we've allocated \$27 mil-lion (over three years) to help find a solution to those traffic prob-lems," he said.

When it comes to highway projects, \$27 million might be considered small change, especially if any possible solution includes creating a boulevard along Fourteen Mile from Orchard Lake to Haggerty, as some propose.


That \$27 million is even less significant, he said, if large portions of it are needed for right-of-

way acquisition. Buying land is increasingly expensive.

Even so, Hartwig — like Hood,
Grant and others — view
Wednesday's meeting with optimism. Nobody wants to create
unrealistic expectations. "But it
could be a beginning," he said.
Farmington Hills city menager
William Costick said this kind of
informational, get-acquainted
meeting is overdue.

"Extending Northwestern Highway may be a dead. But per-haps we can talk about doing something with Fourteen Mile Road."


