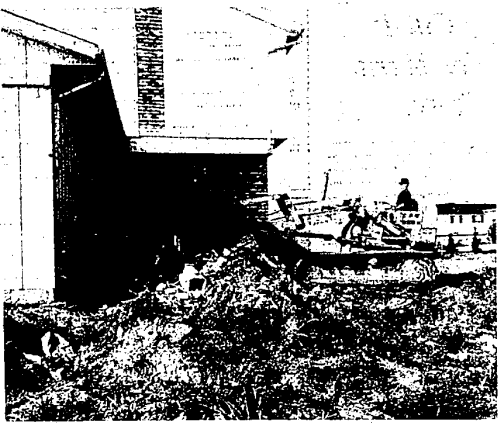


New Home Ordered Moved



PUSH — That's what was done to a house at the corner of Rockledge and Olde Franklin Drive this week when the builder was forced to move a house after the Township Zoning Board of Appeals refused a variance of the setback requirements.

Lot-line setback requirements under the Farmington Township zoning ordinance has required that a completely constructed new home be moved before an occupancy permit will be issued.

The house stands at the corner of Rockledge and Olde Franklin Drive in the township.

A variance to the setback requirements was requested by Town and Country Builders on Aug. 28, but the Township's Zoning Board of Appeals refused the request.

The result is a delay and additional costs.

SY FRYMAN, secretary of the building company, told The Enterprise & Observer that "it is costing us more to move the house than it would to settle the case out of court. "On principle though, I won't settle with the neighbors. I would rather give the money to a legitimate contractor who worked hard for it than to somebody who has their hands out."

Fryman's reference was to a court case filed in the Oakland County Circuit Court by Mr. and Mrs. Sam Chayet of 32539 Olde Franklin Dr., charging that the construction is in violation of the subdivision's deed restrictions.

Charles Lorion, chairman of the Zoning Board of Appeals, said that the variance had been denied because the township had encountered similar problems before with the same builder.

the problem on the setback requirements no one seems to know. The township building department did inspect the site when the foundation was dug, but stakes were not laid out on the property line at that time. Township officials stopped construction of the work on the house following complaints of the neighbors that the setbacks were not being followed. When the "stop work" order was issued in July, construction work on the house was reportedly two-thirds complete.
