Merchandise will be discounted 25 to 35 percent, said company president James B. Fowler. "We consider this an extremely positive move. We're excleted about it," said Fowler. "Floor space vacated by furni-tive will be absorbed by expanded departments for apparel, accesso-ites and home decor, he said. Stores in Dearborn, East Lans-ing, Jackson and Kalamazoo also art affected. However, furniture departments will remain in the company's Soginaw and Sarasota, Fla., stores.

"Those operations do well with furniture. They service large geo-graphic areas," said Fowler. "Steve White, furniture manager in the Livounis store at Six Mile and Newburgh, verified the sale begins this week but wouldn't say how it will be marketed. The fur-niture gallery is a sprawing de-partment on the second floor near Jacobson's restaurant. "We started this process in our Grosse Pointe store last Janu-dry," Fowler said. "We moved our crosser Pointe store last Janu-dry, "Fowler said. "We moved our prease for into the furniture prea and we expanded ready to purceasful."

Successful conversions from furniture to core merchandise were also completed in Rochester

and Ann Arbor. "Furniture, which comprises less than 2 percent of company-wide sales, did not meet our fi-nancial performance standards at these six stores," said Mark K. Rosenfeld, choirman and CEO of the Jackson-based retailer.

"In addition, wood and uphal-stered furniture, mattresses and floor coverings require a disprp-portionate amount of floor space, inventory dollars and operational support," he said.

"These moves will allow us to expand our fashion apparel, ac-cessories and home decorative de-partments, each of which is a key to our strategic plan of being 's high service fashion specialty.re-tailer."
