Burberrys went Hollywood in the 1940s when Marlene Dietrich and Bette Davis were trenchecate in "Witness for the Prosecution" and "Deception." Burt Lancaster and Robert Mitchum sported them in "Sorry, Wrong Number" and "Farewell My Lovely."
The yellow raincoat worn by Warren Bestry as Dick Tracy in 1990 was also designed by Burberrys. Other celebrated customers have included Sir Winston Churchill, Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, Rudyard Kipling, George Bernard Shaw, Katharine Hepburn and Dustin Hoffman, to name a few.
The Burberry, from its head quarters in London's Haymarket featuring its distinctive pleid lining, is known and recognizable the world over. The exhibit in the Troy store will include The Dick Tracy cost, a 1934 RAF officer's full dress uniform, a 1912 woman's motoring cost, a 1910 aviator's couffit, and the collection's old-est piece, a 1904 Shackleton Outrig Suit.
